## News from Consuelo...

My stories will be out of order.

We are spending four nights in this city I wanted to visit 20 years ago. We flew in from Bombay (Mumbai). Airport security within India is not as stringent as an international flight to India. Every bag is tagged, and stamped through every checkpoint. It's ok to leave on your shoes, carry large bottles of water, and no small plastic bags are necessary. Men and women go through separate lines.

Lemon Tree Hotel is the one I picked because of its good reviews, and the service is wonderful. Indian hospitality is some of the best in the world. The breakfast buffet is different every day, and I am enjoying the local cuisine. I am eating 80% vegetarian, and could live with this food forever. I think I'm losing my stomach bump.

Purpose of visit to this area.

We are going back in time visiting ancient sites. Ellora Caves are located about 30 kilometers north of Aurangabad (Maharashtra ?) state. The series of caves are carved into the rock wall. they represent several religions, Buddhist, Hindu, Jain..... and were carved over a period of time. Some were carved from the top down, as churches in Ethiopia. Craftsmen were brought from Karnataka and settled in the area to complete the project spanning generations. Ellora is still for the pilgrims, so we had to remove shoes for some of the caves. Many lesser caves were for monks' quarters, and some were unfinished.

Our car could drive to some, and we had to walk to others. It is very hot here. The engineering is amazing. One cave exhibited a beautiful arched chapel for Buddha. Columns and details remind one of Egypt and the Middle East; after all, this was on the Silk road route.

There is always the gauntlet of relentless vendors, who chide you for wasting their time, after hounding you as you make the rounds, and do not buy from them.

Admission for Indian and surrounding country residents is 10Rs, and for us foreigners, the cost is 250Rs. I get about 48.50 Rs per dollar using the ATM.

Fort Dalautibad ?

After a day at Ellora, stopping here wasn't a good idea. If you want to go to the top, you climb 750 steps. We did the lower portion, which involved less climbing, but lots of walking. I love forts, and thought about going back today, but Greg can't do the steps, and I don't want to go alone.. This fort was never breached by the enemy. Only subterfuge allowed the enemy in. It dates from the Deccan period, and I believe the British had it at one time. It is huge, with many walls, ruins of building, pools, etc. There is a zig zag dark passage, a moat that once housed crocodiles, temples, bath house, pools, palace, cannon, and much left uncovered. They say the view from the top is outstanding. Admission here is 100 Rs per person.

Bollywood stars

I forgot from the last time in India, but we of the pale skin are treated like celebrities. Families line up to be photographed with us, and the children want our autographs.

Ajanta Caves will be next.

Today we'll visit the fake Taj Majhal which is supposed to be a poor copy, and I'll shop for a salwar and chameze or local style clothes. They have a nice swimming pools here, so I'll do that, and have a manicure while Greg gets a foot massage.
